Once again the annual Blue Oyster *Graduate Show* is upon us. Each year Otago School of Art's *Site* exhibition is scoured to find new and emerging artists. This year only four artists were selected, meaning each artist or collaboration has a significant gallery space. Often *The Graduate Show* is simply a group reshowing of works created while at artschool, but this year, due to the performative nature of the selected artists, the possibility of creating new works has been encouraged.

David Good implements the language of hip hop to reinterpret the arts. He does this through sampling, remixing and looping New Zealand film, art, dance, or music. His work addresses the effects globalization can have on culture, to the point of cultural hybridization.

SACSAP is name of the corporation created by two artists. It investigates through parody the ways corporations muscle into positions of power, whilst being extremely efficient and impersonal. Performances, interventions and business relations will all be a part of SACSAP's continued economic development project.
